Farmilo has an active School Parliament who help make decisions about the school. The pupils were elected by their peers. Children vote for different things within their classes and use different ways to represent this. Staff are involved in some of the decision making about the school. Parents views are taken into account when drafting new policies such as the Parent's Code of Conduct	The school has a Code of Conduct for Pupils aswell as one for staff and another for Parents. Children are taught why rules are important. The Home School Agreement lists what children parents and school all agree to do. There are rewards and sanctions in place to support the systems. The Local Police make visits to the school where there are links to topic learning. Children learn about DARE. Roles and responsibilities of all are taught across the school.	Children are encouraged to have their own opinions and to express them in a way that is not hurtful to others. Children are involved in discussions and debates about topics linked to the curriculum and the wider world.	Assembly themes teach children real values about respect. RE topics and themes link closely to this. School uses Stonewall resources to celebrate diversity and difference as well as Anti-bullying days. Children are encouraged to work with others through R-Time and DEAR. Farmilo still teaches some of the aspects of the SEAL curriculum to support this development. School logs prejudiced related incidents and encourages children to engage with wider world themes through topic learning
